Atonement & Redemption

The Hebrew word KAPHAR (atonement [Exo.29:36-37]) means "to cover". It implies grave variance (odds) between 2 parties; therefore, atonement makes satisfaction between them. It pacifies the offended party:

And say ye moreover, behold thy servant Jacob is behind us, for he said, I will *APPEASE* him with a present that goeth before me, and afterwards I will see his face peradventure he will accept me.

Gen.32:20

That thou mayest remember and be confounded, and never open thy mouth anymore because of thy shame, when I am **PACIFIED** toward thee for all that thou hast done, saith the Lord

Eze.16:63

Atonement appeases the wrath of an offended party by bearing the penalty due to the offender.

The same Hebrew word **KAPHAR** is 4 times translated <u>reconciliation</u> also, which means "to cover by a sin offering, to make atonement" (at-one-ment):

And no sin offering, whereof any of the blood is brought into the tabernacle of the congregation to **RECONCILE** withal in the holy place, shall be eaten, it shall be burnt with fire.

Lev.6:30

"And when he hath made an end of *RECONCILIATING* the holy place, and the tabernacle of the congregation, and the altar, he shall bring a live goat.

Lev.16:20

...to make *RECONCILIATION* for the house of Israel.

Eze.45:17-20

And thou shall offer every day a bullock for a sin offering for **ATONEMENT**: and thou shall cleanse the altar, when thou hast made an **ATONEMENT**, for it, and thou shall anoint it, to sanctify it. Seven days shalt thou make an **ATONEMENT** for the altar and sanctify it; and it shall be an altar most holy: whatsoever toucheth the altar shall be holy.

Exo.29:36-37

For if, when we were enemies, we were **RECONCILED** to God, by the death of His Son, much more, being **RECONCILED**, we shall be saved by His life. And not only so, but we also joy in God thru our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the **ATONEMENT**.

Rom.5:10-11

It makes provision for cleansing from sin (typical) [Lev.16:30-34].

The offended party is propitiated (satisfied, appeased) by atonement:

Whom God hath set forth to be a **PROPITIATION** thru faith in His blood, to declare His righteousness for the remission of sins that are passed, thru the forbearance of God.

Rom.5:25

And He is the *PROPITIATION* for our sins, and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world.

1.Jo.2:2

Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us, and sent His Son to be the PROPITIATION for our sins.	1Jo.4:10	
Wherefore in all things it behoved Him to be made like unto His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make <i>RECONCILIATION</i> for the sins of the people.	Heb.2:17	
A corresponding price is paid for harm done:		
Who gave Himself a RANSOM for all, to be testified in due time.	1Ti.2:6	
Even as the Son of Man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a RANSOM for many.	Mat.29:28	
Reconciliation means a thorough change from:		
And that He might RECONCILE both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby.	Eph.2:16	
And having made peace thru the blood of His cross, by Him to <i>RECONCILE</i> all things into Himself; by Him, I say, whether they be things in earth, or things in heaven" "And you that were sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath He <i>RECONCILED</i> .	Col.1:20-21	
And all things are of God, who hath RECONCILED us to Himself by Jesus Christ and hath given to us the ministry of RECONCILIATION . To wit, that God was in Christ, RECONCILIATING the world unto Himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of	200 5.10 10	
RECONCILIATION.	2Co.5:18-19	
The Hebrew word KOPHER refers to a <u>ransom</u> and has the meaning of "a covering":		

Then thou taketh the sum of the children of Israel after their number, then shall thou give every man a *RANSOM* for his soul unto the Lord, when thou numberest them, that there be no plague among them.

Exo.30:12

The sinner had to pay a ransom (restitution), make full amends [Ex.21:23-25, 30].

The Greek word LUTROO has the meaning of "to loose by a price". In Scripture, it is rendered as the word redeem or redemption:

But we trusted that it had been He which should have <i>REDEEMED</i> Israel.	Luk.24:21
Who gave himself for us, that He might REDEEM us from all iniquity.	Tiu.2:14
"Neither by the blood of goats or calves, but by His own blood He entered in once into the holy place having obtained eternal <i>REDEMPTION</i> for us.	Heb.9:12
"Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not <i>REDEEMED</i> with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and	
without spot.	1Pe.2:18-19

The Greek word APOLUTROSIS means "a loosing away" and is translated as the word redemption:

Being justified freely by his grace thru the <i>REDEMPTION</i> that is in Christ Jesus.	Rom.3:24
And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the <i>REDEMPTION</i> of our body.	Rom.8:23
In whom we have <i>REDEMPTION</i> thru His blood, the forgiveness of sins according to the riches of His grace.	Eph.1:7
And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of <i>REDEMPTION</i> .	Eph.4:30
In whom we have <i>REDEMPTION</i> thru His blood, even the forgiveness of sins.	Col.1:14

It is defined as the forgiveness of sins; that is, are sins are sent away. We are divorced from them, set free from them. Calvary is between us and our sins.
