Preface

GOALS

To Build Faith: Knowledge of God's Word (Bible) builds up our faith that directs our spiritual walk [Rom.10:17]. Three times in the Bible we read, "*the just shall live by faith*" [Rom.1:17, Gal.3:11, Heb.10:38]. Faith provides direction to our lives [Psa.119:105]. When we need help, we are able to go to the Bible because we have learned to rightly divide the truth [2Ti.2:15].

To Become Established in God's Word (Bible): God wants us to become so established that we are not tossed around with every wind (spirit) of doctrine [Eph.4:14]. Being rooted in Biblical scripture, we are able to apprehend (grasp with the understanding) the fullness of God's truth. Through God's Word (Bible), Jesus sanctifies and cleanses us with a washing process [Eph.5:26].

To Run a Race of Faith: Oh that we might have a desire to know Jesus [Phi.3:10-14] and run the race of faith!

BIBLE SCRIPTURE REFERENCE

All Biblical scripture references in this study book are taken from the King James Version. If any other translation is used, it will be shown following the Biblical scripture reference.

The Bible contains \cdot the mind of God, \cdot the state of man, \cdot the way of salvation, and \cdot the happiness of believers. The Bible's doctrines are holy, its precepts binding, and its histories true. The Bible contains light to direct you, spiritual food to support you, and comfort to cheer you. Jesus is the grand subject of the Bible. God's Word (Bible) was designed for our good and the results are to the glory of God. Biblical scriptures should fill your memory, rule your heart, and guide your feet. Read the Bible slowly, frequently, and prayerfully. Biblical knowledge involves the highest responsibility. It rewards the greatest labor and condemns all who trifle with the Bible's sacred contents.

SUGGESTIONS TO STUDENTS

Do not try to master the Bible all at once or become upset if you do not understand what you have read. Biblical scriptures are revealed "precept upon precept: line upon line; here a little, and there a little" [Isa.28:10].

Read the lesson through at one sitting if possible, but do not hurry over it. Read it slowly and give it a chance to grip your heart and mind. As you read, ask God to give you something special from His Word. Stay in the lesson; do not skip around in the Bible. You are spending your time to gain knowledge of God's Word (Bible); learn to spend this time wisely.

There is no shortcut to getting Biblical knowledge; it is obtained through prayer, study, and meditation. We suggest that you get all you can directly from the Bible before consulting notes written by someone else. The Holy Spirit (God's gift) inspired the Word of God (Bible) and was given for the specific purpose of guiding us into all truth [Eph.1:17-18].

"Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come."

Joh.16:13

Always read the lesson through at least once, more if possible. Observe the instructions given in the Bible concerning reading God's Word [1Ti.4:13, Eph.3:4].

PREPARING TO STUDY

When we study, our attitude is very important, "And if any man think that he knoweth any thing, he knoweth nothing yet as he ought to know" [1Co.8:2].

Meditate on God's Word (Bible). Note the promise given to the man who meditates on Biblical scriptures day and night, "He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers" [Psa.1:1-3].

Take Biblical scripture at face value. Do not try to make it prove a point. Keep in mind that the Bible is the "inspired word of God." There is a promise to those who read, hear, and keep Biblical scriptures, but a curse is pronounced on those who add to them.

"Blessed is he that readeth, and they that hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written therein: for the time is at hand."

• The **Ground**: The Heart of Man.

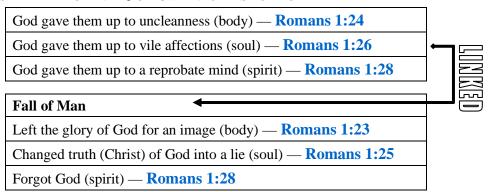

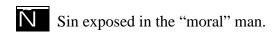

Romans 4

HISTORICAL SYNOPSIS OF THE EARLY LIVES OF ABRAHAM AND DAVID

Abraham

Abraham (*father of a multitude*, 1996-1822 BC) — was the son of Terah and his family, a branch of the descendants of Shem, settled in Ur of the Chaldees, beyond the Euphrates, where Abraham was born. At the first call of God [Act.7:2-4], he left his idolatrous kindred, and went to Haran (about 300 miles north), in Mesopotamia.

Note

Ur was consecrated to the worship of Sin, the Babylonian moon god. It shared this honor, however, with another city, the city of Haran, or Harran. [Easton's Bible Dictionary]

On the death of his father (Terah died at 205 years of age), being directed by a second call, accompanied by a covenant promise from God [Gen.12:1-2], Abram, with Sarai and his nephew Lot, pursued a course to the land of Canaan [Heb.11:8]—trusting implicitly {had complete faith} in the guidance of God who had called him. His name was changed (when Ishmael was 13 years old) from Abram to Abraham [Gen.17:5].

David

David (beloved) youngest son of Jesse (born in Bethlehem in 1085 B.C. of the tribe of Judah); his mother's name is not recorded. As to his personal appearance, he may have been red-haired, with beautiful eyes and a fair face [1Sa.16:12; 1Sa.17:42]. David's early occupation was that of tending his father's sheep in Judah. We first read of him in 1 Samuel 17:34-35 regarding his encounters with wild beasts of the field. During this time, the prophet Samuel was directed by God [1Sa.16:1] that "I will send thee to Jesse the Bethlehemite: for I have provided me a king among his sons". Out of Jesse's 8 sons, only David (the youngest) was recognized by Samuel as the one who was chosen by God to succeed Saul. Even after being anointed as the King of Israel, David returned to the life of a shepherd boy [1Sa.16:13-14].

Next, we see David being sent for to play for King Saul to soothe his "evil spirit from the LORD" [1Sa.16:15] that troubled him. Several years later, David victoriously stands over the dead body of Goliath, felled with a single smooth stone from a shepherd's sling.

We cannot keep the old tree from bearing fruit by restrictions. The Word of God goes deeper than that. It goes even to the root and cuts down the tree.

Christ identified Himself with us in our sin and died in our place. In God's provision of grace, He reckons that we also died with Christ. We were cut off with Him as the old creation but were raised up together with Him in the new creation.

Rom.6-7 — There are 3 arguments against the question, "shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound?"

- 1. We died in the old Adam (old creation) yet arose in Christ, a new life (new creation).
- 2. We left the employ of our old boss (sin); we now have a new master (new work).
- 3. Our old husband died (no fruit); we now have a new husband (new fruit).

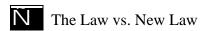

Jos.10 — Joshua (represents Christ) must stand up to the defense of the Gibeonite (represents the body) who has offered himself a "living sacrifice" unto God.

THE 5 KINGS (OLD CREATION)

The 5 kings represent certain principles within us. These principles must be judged before we can have complete victory over our old creation (old man, soulish nature).

- Our soulish nature seeks to obey The Law from the source of self-goodness.
- Our new creation (new man) obeys for the glory of God and seeks the welfare of our neighbor.

These 5 kings (self-righteousness, insatiable desires, wild ass [Rom.8:7], resplendent [1Jo.2:16], and speaker) come up against us to hinder our wholehearted yielding to the complete will of God. However, the Lord will fight and deliver the enemy into the hand of Joshua (represents Christ).

VICTORY OVER THE 5 "KINGS"

The 5 kings represent the root of sin in the flesh. The "root" hides for a time. Yet, we see how Joshua searches each one of them out and puts them to death with the sword (represents God's Word [Bible]).

The only way we come into the possession of Jerusalem (represents the **peace** of God) and learn that Christ satisfies every desire of our heart is to also put to "death" the 5 "kings" in our own life.

We dwell in **communion** with God, having been raised up with Christ and seated with Him in the heavenlies (**elevation**).

The Word of God becomes the man of our counsel.

The monotonous "wheel of destiny" which formerly went round and round [Ecc.1:4-7], now becomes geared to the perfect will of God. The perfect will of God rolls on and on into new and greater victories for us, where we find that all things are working together for our good [Rom.8:28].

WHY ROMANS 16:1-20 BELONGS TO EPHESIANS.

The reasons why be believe that Romans 16:1—20 rightly belongs to the book of Ephesians are:

- The saints named in Romans 16 lived in Ephesus (or in that vicinity) not in Rome.
- Aquila and Priscilla lived in Ephesus and had a church in their home.
- Epaenetus [Rom.15:5], is the first fruits of Asia (not Achaia and is written in the Revised Version).
- Rom.16:20 Seems to be the culmination of the Ephesian warfare mentioned in Eph.6.
- Rom.14:21-23 Evidently belongs to the letter to Rome, because some of those men mentioned lived in Corinth.
- · Phoebe lived in Cenchrea and no doubt was recommended to the church at Ephesus.
- The Apostle Paul held all these people, whom he sends greetings to, in the highest spiritual regard. They were choice saints...true to his teaching. The Apostle Paul knew no man after the flesh; but he loved these saints dearly in Christ. The phase "in Christ" is written 4 times, the phrase "in the Lord" 6 times, and "unto Christ" 1 time. He speaks of these 3 men not merely as helpers, but as "coworkers with him" [Rom.15:8-9]. He calls 4 of them "my beloved." The saints at Ephesus were already established. The saints at Rome had not yet heard the Apostle Paul's gospel...they were strangers to him.

Rom.16:7-12 — Notice how the Apostle Paul gave credit to those (he listed them) to whom it is due. See how the Lord takes notice of those...

LESSON 18

1 Corinthians

INTRODUCTION

The Apostle Paul wrote 14 of the 21 letters (epistles or books) in the New Testament. This lends weight to the Apostle Paul's letters and that his writings alone contain the message to The Church.

Note

The letters written by the Apostle Paul take up 5 times as much space as do the other 7 New Testament books written by Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, James the Less (the Lord's brother), Apostle Peter, and Judas (the brother of James the Less).

The Apostle Paul's letters, beginning with Romans and ending with Hebrews, comprise the commencement, development, and culmination of the **Gospel of God** for this parenthetical age (the sphere of truth which is transcendent, wonderful, deep, and glorious because it is the fullest expression of Divine Grace).

THE RELATION OF THE EPISTLES

- Romans answers to Exodus (in the Old Testament) and is the foundation of all doctrine contained in the other epistles.
- 1 Corinthians answers to Numbers; setting The Church in order, even as Moses set up the Tabernacle in the wilderness.
- 2 Corinthians to Leviticus; the priestly ministry in The Church, even as Aaron and his sons ministered in the Tabernacle.

This outline is from the 1 *CorinthiansGrace & Glory* study book by *A. S. COPLEY*. The revelation to John is not included in this contrast, because it stands alone as a different last-day message.

It is exceedingly essential to understand the point of Division 2, and to see the place God gave the Apostle Paul.

DIVISION 1, THE DIVINE SCHEME

As materials for the Tabernacle were gathered, so must the material for the assembly of God be gathered. The primary thought in the first division is "gathering." Hence, the following 3 subdivisions in this first main division:

- 1. **The Gathering Center**, One Name, the Lord Jesus Christ [1Co.1].
- 2. **The Gathering Power**, One Spirit, the Holy Spirit [1Co.2].
- 3. **The Gathering Purpose**, One Temple, the Dwelling Place of God [1Co.3].

Without acknowledgement of the 3 personalities of the Godhead, there can be no order in The Church. The Man Christ Jesus, not God, is the Head of His body. The Holy Spirit is the Executor of the Divine Will among men. The eternal purpose of God in the union of Christ and His people, was to provide a dwelling place for God [Rev.21:3]. Christ and His people will constitute that Tabernacle [Eph.2:22].

All the troubles of Christendom are outlined in this epistle, even as the cause of all her troubles is announced in 1 Corinthians 1:10-13. Departure from the divine truth of one authoritative name, **Lord Jesus Christ**, and one body, has brought about the divisions in Christendom; therefore, the only remedy is to return to these basic truths.

INTRODUCTION

Romans finds us down in Egypt (sin, bondage, the world). Romans delivers us from the sentence of death through the Passover (Jesus' blood). Romans delivers us from Egypt through the Red Sea (death and resurrection). Romans brings us through the wilderness (warfare within) and into the land of Canaan (heavenlies in Christ).

- 1 Corinthians was written for babes who have not learned to walk in the truth of Romans.
- **2 Corinthians** was written to those who walk in the light, bringing them into a closer fellowship with God (worship-priestly ministry).

Galatians was written for those who left the doctrine of Romans, and became ensnared with the Jews religion (works of The Law).

Ephesians shows our inheritance in Canaan (in Christ) and our warfare with the principalities of Satan.

Philippians encourages saints to lay hold of Ephesian truth and to run in the race to win Christ as our Prize (Bridegroom).

Colossians was written to correct those who left Ephesian truth and taught philosophies of men.

1 Thessalonians declares the culmination of the mystery of godliness, the translation of The Church.

2 Thessalonians is for the comfort of those who do not qualify for the 1st translation, but will be left on earth awaiting Christ's revelation.

1 Corinthians 7, Ranks Foreshadowed

Note

This outline is from the 1 Corinthians Grace & Glory study book by A. S. COPLEY.

MANNER OF THE APOSTLE PAUL'S ADDRESS

- 1. Partly "by permission" [1Co.7:6].
- 2. He gives his "*judgment*" [1Co.7:40] "*As one that hath obtained mercy of the Lord to be faithful*" [1Co.7:25].
- 3. "I think also that I have the Spirit of God" [1Co.7:40].
- 4. "But to the rest speak I, not the Lord" [1Co.7:12].

THE APOSTLE'S MOTIVE FOR WRITING

- 1. He seeks our good [1Co.7:1, 26].
- 2. He would save us from "trouble in the flesh" [1Co.7:28].
- 3. He declares, "I would have you without carefulness" [1Co.7:32].
- 4. "I speak for your own profit; ... that ye may attend upon the Lord without distraction" [1Co.7:35].

PRESSING ARGUMENT

Note the pressing argument: "But this I said, brethren, the time is short" [1Co.7:29].

All the apostles emphasized the imminence of the coming of Jesus. 1 Corinthians 7:29-31 shows the attitude believers should hold towards all earthly relationships and affairs.

CHIEF VERSE WITH SUPREME THOUGHT

Consider the chief verse, which holds in it the supreme thought of the chapter:

"Brethren, let every man, wherein he is called, therein abide with God..."

Not only in the marriage relation, but also in every relation. "Ye are bought with a price," alluding to slaves who are bought by their masters. God has purchased us through the death of His Son. We are His. Therefore, we are seeking His glory alone, while waiting for the coming of Jesus. "Be not ye the servants of men" in your service, or in marrying, or in buying or selling.

TYPICAL TURN TO THE CHAPTER

There is also a typical turn to the chapter that we do well to consider; for the teaching relative to Christ in mystery is the ultimate of all of the Apostle Paul's writings. Hence, we have 3 ranks of believers foreshadowed: ŒBridal believers, • Servant believers, and Ž Virgin believers.

SERVANTS

Some saints serve God, and have no higher aspiration. Indeed, they think it the highest, most noble relationship to God. Like Martha, they grumble if others are not on the job continually. Although a closer place is offered to them, they reuse it. They are willing to suffer for Christ, but they shun "the reproach of Christ," the stigma of walking alone with Him [Heb.13:13]. They are content to wave palms of victory here before the Crowned One; and they will do the same in glory [Rev.7:9-10].

VIRGINS

Compare 1 Corinthians 7:36, 39 with 2 Corinthians 11:2. Virgin believers are concealed to the world, but separated unto God. Although all bridal believers are of virgin character, that is, pure, separated, concealed, yet not all of the virgin believers will be in The Bride. The 5 wise virgins of Matthew 25 are not The Bride of the Lamb. They are "her companions that follow her" [Psa.45:14]. In Revelation 14 we read, "they follow the Lamb."

DEFINITION — **Alma**The Hebrew word **ALMA** means not only "one unmarried," but also "one concealed."

THE BRIDE

Note how 1 Corinthians 7:7, "Every man hath his proper gift of God," gives 1 Corinthians 7:1-5 depth and sacredness. God ordained the marriage relation before sin entered and brought a false shame upon the human family.

Note

Heb.13:4 — "Marriage is honorable in all, and the bed undefiled: but whoremongers and adulterers God will judge."

However, his is only figurative of the greater, more profound union of Christ and The Church. Genesis 2:18 looks forward to God's purpose to build a Bride for His Son [Eph.5:32-33]. The proper gift of God to some saints is the burning bridal love for Him who first loved us. No marvel that Mary forgot service in her adoration of her wonderful Lord [Psa.45:10-11].

Note

Historically, the church in Corinth consisted principally of non-Jews whose beliefs were based on Phoenician religion and mythology. It was not uncommon to eat meat offered to idols...and there were several of them!

"Ye know that ye were Gentiles, carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ye were led." [1Co.12:2]

The Phoenicians, who settled here very early, left many traces of their civilization in the industrial arts, such as dyeing and weaving, as well as in their religion and mythology. The Corinthian cults of Aphrodite, of Melikertes (Melkart) and of Athene Phoenike are of Phoenician origin. Poseidon, too, and other sea deities were held in high esteem.

The question frequently asked concerning this portion of Scripture is "Does the Apostle Paul forbid women to speak at all or to pray or prophesy in church?" The main verse that constitutes the foundation of all that Paul says in 1 Corinthians 14:

"For God is not the author of confusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints."

The instruction of Paul is found in Vs. 39: "Therefore, my brethren, desire earnestly to prophesy, meaning "be zealous about giving forth the word of God."

In Vs. 40, Paul states, "But let all things be done decently and in order." This as a principle applies to all the churches (Vs. 34) although it was born out of a practice existing only in Corinth.

When Paul says, "Your women in the churches, let them be silent" (Vs. 40), it was not an instruction to all the men in general not to permit any women to speak in church, but to husbands to guide and teach their own wives lest they produce confusion and disturbance in a meeting. This may have resulted from the exercising of a gift that they thought they had and were anxious to externalize. One cannot take Paul's indirect imperative in 1 Corinthians 14:34, "Let the women keep silent in the churches," as absolute. It must be taken in conjunction with what follows: "for they are not permitted to speak." The word **speak** should be taken to mean "uttering sounds that are incoherent

and not understood by others." Paul says that instead it is better to have silence. Paul uses the same words **keep silent** to admonish a man who speaks in an unknown tongue without an interpreter (Vs. 28, 30). What Paul is saying is that only one man must speak at a time, for if two speak at once, there will be confusion. The phrase, "let him keep silent" is then qualified to the woman (Vs. 34). Under no circumstances does the injunction of Paul indicate that women should not utter a word at any time during the church service. The issue is not men versus women, but it is confusion versus order. In God's sight, it makes no difference who causes the confusion. It is a shame for any woman to bring confusion into the local church (Vs. 35), even as it is for any man to do so. Furthermore, the word GUNAFKES {1135} should not be translated as "women" in its generic sense, but as "wives" (Vs. 34). It is wives who should submit (HUPOTASSOMAI, {5293}) to their own husbands (Vs. 35, from ANDRAS {435}). The whole argument is not the subjection of women to men in general, but of wives to their own husbands in the family unit that has been ordained by God (see note on 1Ti.2:9-15). Paul states the principle that the duty of the husbands is to restrain their own wives from outbursts during the worship service. Whenever Paul speaks of submissiveness by a woman, it is always on the part of a wife to her own husband.

TITHING

Note

In the Pentateuch, tithing is written about in 3 places:

- 1. Œ Lev.27:30-33 says a tithe had to be given of the seed of the land, i.e. of the crops, of the fruit of the tree (oil and wine) and of the herd or the flock. As the herds and flocks went out to pasture they were counted, and every 10th animal was reckoned holy to the Lord. The owner was not allowed to choose whether the animal was bad or good, nor could he change any of them.
- 2. Num.18:21-32 says that a 10% tithe must be paid to the Levites by Israel as the Levite's inheritance and for their service of the tabernacle. The Levites were to offer from a heave offering, a tithe of a tithe, to the priests [Neh.10:39].
- 3. Ž Deut.12:5-6, 11, 18 states that the tithe is to be brought "unto the place which Yahweh your God shall choose out of all your tribes, to put his name there," i.e. to Jerusalem. Deu.26:12-15 says that in the 3rd year, after a feast, the landowner should go up himself before the Lord his God, i.e. to Jerusalem, and ask God's blessing on his deed. In this passage this 3rd year is called "the year of tithing."

GIVING — UNDER THE LAW (GOD DRIVEN)

Israel was **required** to give a 10% tithe to the Levites [Gen.14:20; Lev.27:30,32; Deu.14:22; Heb.7:4]. This tithe was to cover the service of the Levites in the Tabernacle in the wilderness (later in the Temple) [Num.18:21].

GIVING — UNDER GRACE (HEART-DRIVEN)
