## Use of "Grace" in Pauline Epistles

## WHAT IS GRACE?

In the Bible, 163 verses contain the word "grace". Over half of those references, 93 to be exact, are found throughout the epistles written by the Apostle Paul (apostle the Gentiles [Romans 1:13]). By way of comparison (table below), consider the definition of the word "grace" in Scripture as well as in the English language.

Another way to look at "grace" is in light of its varied New Testament attributes<sup>1</sup> (not only from the Pauline epistles):

- ⇒ Reference to the Divine favor or "grace" [Ac.7:10].
- ⇒ Stress on its freeness and universality, its spontaneous character, as in the case of God's redemptive mercy, and the pleasure or joy He designs for the recipient [Ac.14:26].
- $\Rightarrow$  Set in contrast with **debt**, [Rom.4:4,16], with **works** [Rom.11:6], and with **law** [Jn.1:17].
- ⇒ On the part of the receiver, gratitude ("thanks") [Rom.6:17].
- ⇒ The effect of "grace," the spiritual state of those who have experienced its exercise [Rom.5:2, 1Pet.5:12, 2Pet.3:18].
